Leith Franklin Cricket Club was founded in 1852 by workers in nearby Fullartons Printing Works and was named after Benjamin Franklin, inventor and printer. In various incarnations, they have played cricket on the Leith links since before 1850. The club merged with Leith Accies in 1988 and have since been known as the Leith Franklin Academicals Cricket Club. In 2002, the club celebrated its 150th anniversary.
