 - d. Letters 1904, 1906, 1914, of Ella Christie to Elizabeth Haldane, those of 1904 written during the Indian journey (8 letters), those of 1906 from Mallorca (2 letters), and those of 1914 from Spain (4 letters).
- 9a. Letters, 1904-12, of Ella Christie, with one letter of 1916, one of 1917 and one of 1918. A large bundle mostly to Alice Stewart with two letters to Elizabeth Haldane. The bulk of the letters describe two journeys to central Asia, 1910 and 1912, some of these letters, undated by the writer, have later been incorrectly dated in pencil. It is obvious from the sense and sequence of the letters, that some of these labelled 1910 are actually of 1912 and vice versa. Several of the letters are duplicated in typescript.
 - b. An article (n.d.), in the hand of Ella Christie entitled "With the Russians in Central Asia".
10. Letters, 1896-1940, of Ella Christie to Alice Stewart. A large bundle of letters with passages reproduced in "Alicella" marked, and often copied in typescript. Arranged in chronological order as far as possible.
