**Papers from Messrs Tods, Murray and Jamieson WS**

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1. Receipt by the covent and canons of Whithorn for 19 pounds Scots for the Whitsunday teinds of the Church of Longcastle, from Alexander Waus of Barnbarroch, 4 July 1554. Signed by Thomas Dowgall, Fynlai Peirson, Wilzem Cranston, George Stevenson, and Dean Patrick ?Dune.
2. Letters of inhibition at the instance of John Waus of Longcastle against the parishioners of Longcastle, preventing them from uplifting or intromitting with the teind sheaves of Longcastle which rightly belonged to Waus, 14 August 1605.
3. Letters of horning at the instance of Sir John Waus of Barnbarroch against the feuars, tacksmen and subtacksmen of the teinds of Longcastle who have not paid the agreed taxation for which Waus is responsible, 8 November 1631.
4. Tack by Sir John Waus of Barnbarroch and John Waus his son and heir in favour of William Baillie of Meikle Dunragit of the teinds of Blairshinnoch and Culbae, 29 April and 12 May 1641.
5. Discharge by Alexander Baillie of Meikle Dunragit to John Waus of Barnbarroch of 12 pounds per year for the 19 years of the tack (No.4). This sum represented the excess that Baillie had been obliged to pay in stipend etc to the minister of Kirkinner over and above the basic 10 pounds which his father had agreed to pay by the original tack, 15 June 1663.
6. Account of money due by Barnbarroch to John Chiesley, writer in Edinburgh. The final receipt is dated 18 January 1698.
7. Declaration by James Dewar merchant in Edinburgh, factor for Alexander (?)Stevenson of Strathore, collector of vacant stipends, that there are no vacancies in the parishes of Kirkinner and Kirkcowan. He therefore discharges Patrick Waus of Barnbarroch of the horning raised against him for payment of money arising from vacant stipends, 29 July 1702.
8. Instrument of sasine in favour of Alexander son of Sir Alexander Don of Newton Bart of ten husbandlands in Ravelaw and four husbandlands in Easterlaws of Whitsome in the parish of Whitsome in Berwickshire, following on a crown resignation, 1 October 1773.
9. Royal precept to the Depute Sheriff of Edinbugh, and the Sheriffs of Perth and Kinross to hold a proper enquiry with a view to retouring William Drummond Stewart as heir to his elder brother in the lands of Grandtully, 23 January 1839.
10. Register of Charters granted by the family of Ross (Lord Ross of Halkhead) to their vassals, 1728-48, mostly relating to lands in the vicinity of Lasswade. The original of the first deed (though not this copy) was in the hand of David Hume, possibly David Hume the philosopher.

11. Retour of service of heir in favour of Sir George Gordon of Haddo bart, for the lands of the Barony of Haddo formerly possessed by his brother, Sir John (d. Mar. 1667), dated 10 September 1669.
12. Copy, charter under the great seal in favour of George, Earl of Aberdeen for the lands of the Barony of Gight alias Shives [Tarves], 23 April 1684.
13. Instrument of sasine, 21 May 1684, in favour of George, Earl of Aberdeen, for lands listed in no.12 above.
14. Copy, charter under the great seal in favour of William, Lord Haddo, for the lands of the Barony of Haddo, 29 April 1708.
15. Copy, charter under the great seal in favour of William, Earl of Aberdeen for lands of Haddo, 26 July 1720.
16. Instrument of resignation by David Graham for William, Earl of Aberdeen, of the lands of the Barony of Gight in favour of Susan, Countess of Aberdeen, in liferent, 26 July 1720.
17. Instrument of sasine in favour of William, Earl of Aberdeen for the lands of the Baronies of Haddo, Kellie and Inverebrie, 5 January 1721.
18. Instrument of sasine in favour of Susan, Countess of Aberdeen for the lands of the Barony of Gight, 7 January 1721.
19. Copy, charter of adjudication and confirmation in favour of William, Earl of Aberdeen, relating to the lands of the Barony of Haddo, 22 June 1744.
20. Copy, charter of confirmation in favour of his heirs executed by George, Earl of Aberdeen, 23 February 1768.
21. Letter, 3 May 1796, of James Douglas, writer in Dunfermline to Archibald Tod of Drygrange, WS, relating to the feu duties of Dunfermline.
22. Court of Session, Second Division, 14 January 1817, 'Defences for Archibald Thomas Fraser of Abertarff and his Curators, - Defenders; Against ... Thomas Alexander Fraser, formerly of Strechin, now of Lovat, and his Curators, - Pursuers'.
