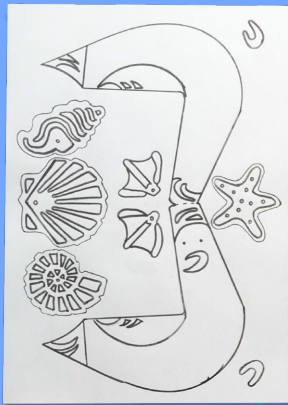
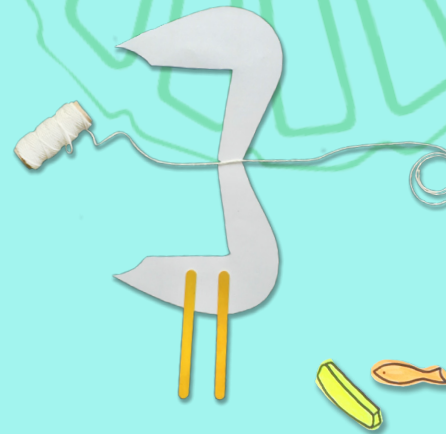


Make your own Salty the Seagull



- Glue: Pritt-stick or similar works well
- Craft Scissors - maybe get an adult to help if you need it
- Felt pens or crayons, if you use Sharpies be sure to protect the table
- Ice Lolly sticks (clean) or plant labels for the legs
- A piece of driftwood, a stick or a wooden spoon
- String or coloured wool to hang the shells and Salty from your stick
- Something to make neat holes, a knitting needle or a hole-punch



- Print out the A4 outline on thin white card or paper
- The card should be thin enough to cut with scissors
- If you don't have card then you can glue the paper onto a spare piece of card: an empty cereal packet for example
- Cut out Salty, colour in and fold the bird over at the top of the bird's head

- Add legs - these could be ice lolly sticks or pipe-cleaners or thick wool
- Glue the legs to the inside of the body



- Glue the body together trapping a long piece of string by Salty's head
- Hang Salty from a piece of drift wood, a stick or a wooden spoon
- Cut out Salty's feet and colour in, glue or knot them to legs
- Cut out beak 1 and 2 and colour in
- Trap some wool and draw a fish or a chip to go between his beak
- Cut out the shells and colour in. Make a hole and attach to the driftwood stick or spoon with coloured wool or string
